



- Has been evolving for a long time
  - Correspondence courses, School of the Air, Open University, etc.
- On line courses : degrees, qualifications, skills
- But Internet and mobile technologies have enabled -

#### Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)

#### What are MOOCs ?



- Massive : 100-10,000 Students
- Open : Open Access, 24/7
- On-line : Web-based
  - Student's own time and location, e.g. home, classroom, library, etc.
- Courses : Usually written by recognised authorities
  - X hours/week (usually 2 8)
  - Y weeks (usually 2 12)
  - Z parts (usually 1 or 2)
- Cheap : Usually free
  - Sometimes offer certificates of participation or accreditation exams at additional cost

#### • Three popular platforms :

• FutureLearn, Coursera, and edX

#### **FutureLearn**



- UK-based part of Open University
- Many partner universities
  - OU, Kings, Shanghai, Sheffield, Cape Town, Australian universities, etc.
- Plus specialist organisations
  - British Council, BFI, British Museum, etc. usually in English
- Courses are free, with tutors/mentors and discussion threads
- 13 Categories over 100 courses scheduled up to 4 months ahead
- Courses 2-10 weeks, 2-4 hours/week, 15-30 items per week
- E-mail notice of responses to your discussion posts
- FutureLearn (free) is less academic than an Open Univ Degree (££££)
- A good place to start MOOCs

### Coursera



- US-based educational platform
- Many partner universities (e.g. Yale, Stanford, Manchester, Edinburgh)
- Online, free, weekly quizzes!, assessments, study groups, discussion threads, blended learning (complements on-campus studies)
- 26 categories, 1463 courses, 877 in English
- May ask for verification to ensure assessments are all your own work
- Best for arts/humanities and multilingual, good mentors/coaches
- Study groups are a differentiator

#### edX



- Another US-based educational platform
- 41 charter members (Harvard, MIT, Caltech, Sorbonne)
- 34 contributors (Smithsonian, Microsoft, etc.)
- 576 courses, 6-12 weeks, 2-10 hours/week
- More formal courses than some e.g. FutureLearn
- Some verified certificates available (cost e.g. US \$100)
- Free, feedback, good interactive tools, discussion boards
- Very good for technology

  - 49 courses currently of which 14 have a course leader

- Use complete courses or modules
- Include in own group program
- Supplement own material
- Use as "homework"
- Could form virtual groups linking with nearby U3A branches
- Do part of course live (as scheduled) or use material after the event as examples or discussion topics
